LEARNING OUTCOME

On completion of Module Eleven you will be able to:

- identify some of the internal parts of the whare tūpuna, and describe what they represent
- correctly pronounce all 33 of your 'key Māori words'.

Navigation Instruction

Start Te Rito.

Click on the section 'The Marae'.

Click on 'Virtual Marae Visit'.

Navigate your way to the wharenuī and go inside. Explore the interior of the wharenuī - the whare tūpuna. Pay attention to areas with information text.

The three new words for your key Māori words flashcards are:

Rangatira (chief)

Whaikōrero (speech, oration)

Mokopuna (grandchild(ren), younger generation)

Use click and drag to learn the correct pronunciation and then run them together. Take note of any macrons that will mean emphasis on that sound (for example whaikōrero).
