Tutorial

Follow the on screen instructions and practice the phrases. Do not rush this activity. Concentrate on your vowel sounds and pronunciation. Run through the list of greetings four or five times. After running through this screen a few times try pre-empting pronunciation of the greeting and then check against the audio clip voice. Pay particular attention to:

Kei te pēhea koe? Kei te pai Tino pai! Kāore i te pai

Now it's time to add three more key Māori words to your flashcards. Today we are looking at long 'a' vowel sounds and we have chosen three words to help you with this:

- **Manaakitanga** (hospitality, caring)
- **Pākehā** (European)
- **Tāne** (husband, man)

As before, practice them first using the pronunciation table.

You will need to pay attention to evening out the stress or emphasis on the syllables. If you are unsure about this please ask either a Māori-speaking colleague for help or your training personnel to assist with the provision of face-to-face language lessons.
