In this Pronunciation Tutorial we introduce Māori greetings and farewells.

**Navigation  
Instruction**

Highlight the menu topic 'Māori Language'.

Click on the category 'Formalities' and then click 'Greetings'.

**Tutorial**

Become familiar with the greetings and farewells provided by clicking on them and watching the movie clip showing how each one is used. Do not rush this activity. Then try to practice the greetings yourself. Concentrate on your vowel sounds and pronunciation. Run through the list of greetings four or five times. After running through this a few times try pre-empting pronunciation of the greeting and then check against the video clip voice. Pay particular attention to:

Tēnā koe                      Tēnā kōrua                      Tēnā koutou

Haere rā                      E noho rā

Ata mārie

Now you are going to add three new key Māori words to your flashcards. The short vowels today will be ‘e’, ‘o’ and ‘u’. The words are:

- **Te** (the)
- **Mokopuna** (grandchild, young generation)
- **Utu** (price, revenge)

Following the same procedure as you did in Module One, use the pronunciation table of Te Rito (under Māori Language/Pronunciation/Basic Sounds) to listen to the words.

**Revision**

Using your flashcards or the pronunciation table in Te Rito, spend ten minutes revising long and short vowels, and consonant sounds. Practice your six ‘key Māori words’.
